

AJIO CEO places second EPCitizen award roster

West Islander Benoit Langevin placed second out of 350 candidates from across Canada for the EPCitizen award for civic engagement. The CEO for Action jeunesse de l'Ouest-de-l'ÎLE (AJOI) accepted the award in Toronto on Dec. 3.

Langevin, a resident of Pierrefonds, was nominated by Lysane Blanchette-Lamothe, the MP for Pierrefonds-Dollard. She praised Langevin for his tireless work helping at-risk young people in the West Island become active in community life.

Winners and runners-up in junior and senior categories for the Everyday Political Citizen Award — EPCitizen for short — were selected by a panel of 17 judges.

Tim Halman, a political-science high school teacher from Dartmouth, N.S., placed first in the senior category. The award is managed by Samara Canada, a charitable organization that encourages civic engagement through a variety of educational initiatives.
